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ASIAN HEALTH COALITION ONE OF NINE INNOVATIVE HEART HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY TO RECEIVE GRANT FROM ASTRAZENECA HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION

Chicago, IL, Sept. 29, 2020 – The Asian Health Coalition's innovation and commitment to improve the heart health of the people of Chicago was recognized with a grant from the AstraZeneca HealthCare Foundation's *Connections for Cardiovascular Health*SM Next *Generation* program. The \$45,000 grant will provide continued funding for their *Cardiovascular Awareness Recognizing Diet and Integration of exercise Options (CARDIO)* program.

Asian Health Coalition is one of nine organizations to receive funding through this first year of the *Connections for Cardiovascular HealthSM Next Generation* program. The program, which builds on the Foundation's <u>Connections for Cardiovascular HealthSM</u> (CCH) program and 10 years of lessons learned to address a leading cause of death in the nation, launched on World Heart Day to elevate awareness of cardiovascular disease and ways to address it at the community level.

"Asian Americans are disproportionately affected by cardiovascular disease and diabetes, however many risk factors for these diseases are modifiable," said Fornessa T. Randal, Executive Director at the Asian Health Coalition.

Under the direction of Alia Southworth, MPH, Director of Chronic and Infectious Disease, the *CARDIO* program has shown success in supporting heart healthy lifestyles among our South Asian participants. "This funding will help us expand our reach to the Chinese community, where *CARDIO* will empower community members with knowledge and techniques to lower their risk for cardiovascular disease and diabetes," said Southworth.

As a key component of the grant, the Asian Health Coalition serves as a mentor for the *Connections for Cardiovascular HealthSM Next Generation* program and guides newly funded organizations to help successfully launch and implement their programs.

"Through *CCH Next Generation*, we're expanding the reach of our program to new communities to continue working to improve heart health across the country," said James W. Blasetto, MD, MPH, FACC, chairman of the AstraZeneca HealthCare Foundation. "We're proud to provide continued support for the Asian Health Coalition and look forward to them sharing lessons learned with our new Grant Awardees and others across the country."

The grant from the AstraZeneca HealthCare Foundation will help the Asian Health Coalition further address health disparities in cardiovascular disease and diabetes within the South Asian and Chinese communities of Chicago. *CARDIO* focuses on educating these at-risk populations, equipping participants to make lifestyle changes that reduce their risk of cardiovascular disease and diabetes. The Asian Health Coalition plans to disseminate a toolkit designed to help organizations implement culturally tailored cardiovascular health programs, similar to the *CARDIO* program, later this year.
